Welcome to Saint Mark's Church. The central figure in today's liturgy is the Blessed Virgin Mary and her vocation as the human instrument of the Incarnation. Today's Gospel is the account of the Annunciation, when Gabriel announced to the Virgin that God had chosen her to be the mother of the Messiah. Mary's humble obedience, "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done unto me according to thy word..." is the model for Christian living. The first reading today is the promise God made to David to establish his line as kings over God's people. This promise to raise up a new king of David's lineage was understood by Jews in the first century as a promise to send the Messiah. In the second reading today Paul concludes his letter to the Church in Rome. He expresses the early Christian proclamation that in Christ the clouded meaning of the Old Testament prophecies has been revealed. In the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, God's plan has been made clear and the hints of that plan in the writings of the prophets have been fulfilled. Christians gather in the liturgy to remember our story: a story which goes back through the ages. The central actor is always God, who acts in history to lead all the creation into the Kingdom. God, who acted in the lives of people in the past such as David and the blessed Virgin, continues to act today in our lives. The Eucharist is the moment of encounter with God in which, like Mary, we respond, "Yes, let it be done to me according to your word."

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath – Week Four is Love

- *Celebrant* When the angel Gabriel visited Mary, announcing God's plan for her to conceive and give birth to the Messiah, "Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?'" (Luke 1:34) And yet, only a few months later, Mary sings to Elizabeth, My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is his name (Luke 1:46-49).
- LEM We, like Mary, hear God's call to be part of making God's dream for our salvation and flourishing a reality, and we question, "How can this be? I am only…" Yet, like Mary, the "onlys" that make us hesitate are gifts God can and will use as God's love transforms us into bearers of good news.
- All: We wait as people who have encountered divine Love that disrupts the status quo and ushers us into abundant life marked by mutual love and peace that flows from the flourishing of all people.
- *Celebrant* We light these candles as signs of our shocking hope, our just peace, our fierce joy, and the love that transforms us. May Love grow within us, transforming us into bold witnesses of God's salvation with our voices and our lives. *Amen.*

The Affirmation of Faith – The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for + the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We pray for the church especially for Justin, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Michael our Presiding Bishop, Lawrence, Geralyn, Daniel, and William our bishops, and for Chris our priest. We pray that you might teach us your ways and that we might walk in your paths. Come Lord Jesus, *and hear our prayer*.

Out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and you, O God, shall judge between the nations. We pray for our nation, and all nations, that your peace would be manifest in every corner of the earth. Come Lord Jesus, *and hear our prayer*.

In your Kingdom, O Lord, wolves lie down with lambs and children play with serpents without fear. We pray for the sick, the suffering, and those in distress of any kind especially the people of Israel, Gaza, Ukraine, Armenia, the United States, and those on our prayer list. (*The people may add petitions for any need or concern.*) We pray that you would heal all injuries, comfort all grief, and settle all wrongs. Come Lord Jesus, *and hear our prayer*.

For all those who have died. (*The people may add petitions for those they wish to remember.*) In the fulness of time, O God, you sent your son, to be born of our sister Mary. And his name was Emmanuel: God With Us. We thank you for your Presence with us, and we pray that you might be always present with those whom we love but see no longer. Come Lord Jesus, *and hear our prayer*.

We thank you, Lord, for all the blessings of this life. (*The people may name their own thanksgivings.*) We also give thanks to God this week for Jennifer Marwood who is celebrating her birthday and to Steve and Donna Turner who are celebrating their wedding anniversary.

For a Birthday

O God, our times are in your hand: Look with favor, we pray, on Jennifer as she begins another year. Grant that she will grow in wisdom and grace, and strengthen her trust in your goodness all the days of her life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

For the Anniversary of a Marriage

O God, you have so consecrated the covenant of marriage that in it is represented the spiritual unity between Christ and his Church: Send your blessing upon Steve & Donna that they may so love, honor, and cherish each other in faithfulness and patience, in wisdom and true godliness, that their lives together may be a witness to your love and forgiveness, and that their home may be a haven of blessing and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



The people stand or kneel as they prefer

Holy God, you dwelt in ark and temple,

and in the fullness of time you became incarnate in the presence of Jesus Christ among us. In him you promise to come among us whenever two or three are gathered and be made known in the breaking of the bread.

Send down your Holy Spirit,

that your church may be dependent on you like your Son's tiny body in Mary's womb. Send that same Spirit upon this bread and this cup that they may be for us the body and blood of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Who, at supper with his disciples, took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying, 'Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

After supper he took the cup.

Again he gave you thanks, and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Great is the mystery of faith. *Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.*

Glorious God, look with favor on the lowliness of your servants; show mercy on those who fear you. Where your children have grown proud, scatter them in the imagination of their hearts; where your people are hungry, fill them with good things. Where the powerful are bent on oppression, bring them down from their thrones; where the rich have no mercy, send them empty away.

For in Christ, you, the mighty, came down from your seat and became humble, that in him the meek might inherit the earth. Reshape your people in the image of Mary, that we may bring forth the fruit of the Spirit in love and joy and peace, until that day when sorrow and tears are no more, and you are all in all, ever one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. *Amen*.
