

The Committal

My heart, therefore, is glad, and my spirit rejoices; my body also shall rest in hope. You will show me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy, and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.

Then, while earth is cast upon the coffin, the Celebrant says these words

In sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to Almighty God our sister Pat; and we commit his ashes to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust. The Lord bless her and keep her, the Lord make his face to shine upon her and be gracious unto her, the Lord lift up his countenance upon her and give her peace. *Amen.*

Then the Celebrant says



The liturgy for the dead is an Easter liturgy. It finds all its meaning in the resurrection. Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we, too, shall be raised.

The liturgy, therefore, is characterized by joy, in the certainty that "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate

us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

This joy, however, does not make human grief unchristian. The very love we have for each other in Christ brings deep sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus himself wept at the grave of his friend. So, while we rejoice that one we love has entered into the nearer presence of our Lord, we sorrow in sympathy with those who mourn.



Obituary for Natalie O'Brien Conklin

Natalie O'Brien Conklin, "Pat," passed peacefully on October 9, 2022, in Sarasota, Florida at the age of 96. She was born in 1926 in New York City. She graduated in 1944 from Westover School in Middlebury, CT, where an endowment scholarship was established in her name.

She was predeceased in 2009 by Theodore B. Conklin Jr., who she married in 1946 in NYC. She is also predeceased by her brothers, William J. O'Brien and Henry L. O'Brien Jr. (Bobbin). Pat and Ted had homes over the years in Manhasset, NY, Westhampton Beach, NY, and Boca Grande, FL. They attended St. Mark's Church in Westhampton Beach and St. Andrews Church in Boca Grande, FL. As President of the Henry L. O'Brien Foundation, she helped to support many organizations in these communities that she had a special fondness for.

While raising 5 children, Pat was active in the Junior League of the North Shore of Long Island, as a girl scout leader and an active mom in all her children's activities, carting numerous kids back and forth to the beach every summer. She was the "unofficial first mate" on Ted's numerous "fixer-upper" boats over the years, enjoying the time on deck while he did repairs below.

Pat loved the beach and swimming in Westhampton and in Florida, and many remember joining her ice skating on Quantuck Bay in winter. All her family and friends could attest to the fact that she was a great letter writer as well as an enthusiastic reader. She also derived a great deal of joy from compiling and sharing photo books of all the family.

Many of us have fond memories of how she could coax 8-10 box turtles out from under her rose garden. With just a bowl of melon, they would all come running to her. How many moms have that talent? In recent years she loved to drive around Boca Grande on her golf cart, stopping to admire the beautiful sunsets, and watching the 4th of July golf cart parade, while enjoying visits from her 11 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren...with another on the way.

Following her passing, many friends and family have expressed that they have fond memories of spending time with the Conklin family over the years, on their boats, at the beach, or in their homes. She represented the last of a generation and her passing represents the end of an era that held fond memories for many.
