NOTES ON TODAY'S READINGS

Welcome to St. Mark's Church. On this final Sunday before Lent, we always have as our Gospel reading the account of Jesus' transfiguration. This event is chosen primarily because it marks the turning point in the story of Jesus. It was on this occasion that Jesus clearly foretold his approaching death and resurrection. Thus we are pointed in our Lenten pilgrimage toward the cross and Easter. The Old Testament reading records Moses' meeting with God on Mt. Sinai in an event like the transfiguration. His forty days and nights with God on the mountain are a prefiguring of our time with God in Lent. The second reading records the memory of the transfiguration event as a sign that the writer's message is truth, being an eyewitness of Jesus' ministry. We are also witnesses as God transforms us into the likeness of Christ. Today the Church uses the Easter word "Alleluia" for the last time until the resurrection is proclaimed at the Great Vigil of Easter. In many churches, the ancient "farewell to Alleluia" hymn (Alleluia, song of gladness, Hymn 122 or 123, The Hymnal 1982) is sung at the conclusion of the service today. "Alleluia" is omitted from the liturgy throughout Lent in order that its restoration at Easter will underscore our experience of renewal on that day

The Word of God

The First Reading Exodus 24:12-18

A reading from the book of Exodus.

The LORD said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them." Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. The glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

The Epistle

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

Reader The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

For peace in Ukraine, that God will keep them safe from the ravages of war and strengthen their resolve for security and justice in the face of aggression. God of light, *show us your glory and hear us.*

For all those injured or wounded in acts of violence, that God will heal their hearts and bodies and fill them with strength and hope. God of light, *show us your glory and hear us*.

For renewal of our deepest self and for the renewal of the earth, that God will heal our brokenness and bring forth new growth in us and in those commended to our prayers, remembering especially those on our Prayer List. (*The people may add their petitions for any need or concern.*) May they find courage and consolation in the face of Christ. God of light, *show us your glory and hear us.*

For those who have died. (*The people may add petitions for those they wish to have remembered.*) We pray that the light of Christ may scatter the darkness for them and for all who mourn their passing. God of Light, *show us your glory and hear us.*

We thank you, Lord for all the blessings of this life. (*The People may add their own thanksgivings.*) We give thanks this week for Kevin Tunney, Morgan Laube, Connor Canty and Pamela Sheiffer who are celebrating their birthdays and to Paul & Lisa Canty who are celebrating the anniversary of their marriage.

If you do not want to receive communion, you are still welcome to come forward, cross your arms over your chest, and receive a blessing from the priest.
